Tree Farm Branded Gift

Conduct at least one new inspection or re-inspection to receive an end-of-year gift.

\$20 Cabela's® Gift Card

Enroll one new Tree Farm. Must submit copy of forest management plan.
(State employees are ineligible for gift cards.)

\$50 Forestry Suppliers Gift Card

Conduct at least three new inspections and/or re-inspections in 2023.
(State employees are ineligible for gift cards.)

College Scholarship

Active inspectors and their children or grandchildren are eligible to apply for a \$500 college scholarship. To qualify, the inspector must have conducted at least one inspection within the last two years. (See application and eligibility details at www.nctreefarm.org.)

All active inspectors are eligible for this recognition.

Golden Inspection Form Award

Submit an inspection form by its due date without any mistakes or missing information, and with notes in at least three sections and receive a \$50 Forestry Suppliers gift card.
(State employees are ineligible for gift cards.)

Bronze, Silver and Gold Hard Hat Awards

Presented to inspectors who enroll 25, 50 or 100 new Tree Farms during their years as an inspector.
